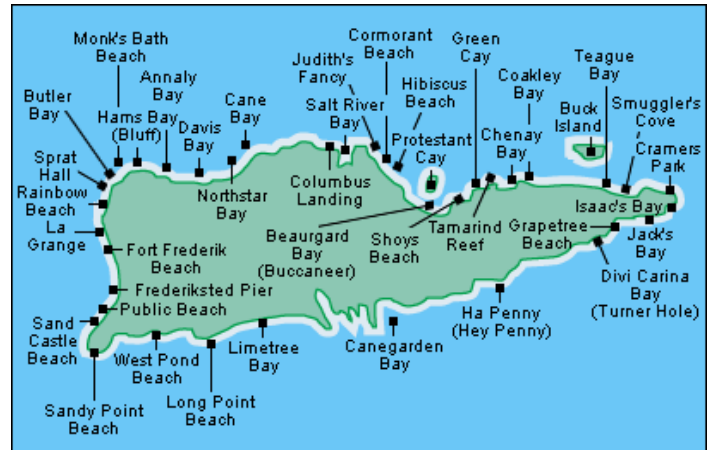


ON THE SUNNY SIDE

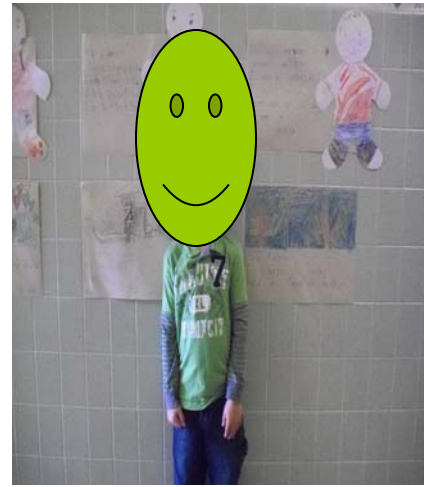
